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Scholarships offered for Environmental Leadership Lab

KAMUELA, Hawai'i—December 7, 2009— Island high school students are invited to join teens from across the country for a week-long outdoor adventure and an outstanding environmental leadership program—the Brown Environmental Leadership Lab (BELL) on Hawai'i Island in April 2010.

The Kohala Center and Brown University are offering tuition scholarships for two students to attend BELL Hawai'i on April 2–9, 2010.

Maryam Palma, a 2009 scholarship recipient, describes BELL Hawai'i as "a sensationally rewarding hands-on learning experience." Students develop leadership skills while studying the island's biology, ecology, and Hawaiian cultural traditions. The program focuses on the interdependence of land, sea, and the life systems they support and is led by leading island scientists, cultural leaders, and environmental experts.

"During the eight days of non-stop enthusiasm, we traveled around the island participating in activities that even those living here hardly have the opportunity to enjoy," Palma said.

Students experience incredible adventures as they learn about the culture and history of the island, participate in the restoration of native forests, explore the geological wonders of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, kayak in coastal waters, camp at Ke'ei, and study coral reef ecology and management.

"I now continue on with my education at UH Mānoa hoping to pursue a degree in environmental studies," said Palma, a graduate of St. Joseph High School in Hilo. "This is largely because of my involvement with BELL during the spring. It is not only a program which gives an understanding of Hawai'i's geography, culture and values, but brings them all together with an incorporation of sustainability and crucial leadership skills—leaving its participants with an awareness towards the Hawaiian Islands (as well as the planet) and possibly even motivation to get involved and take charge within their own communities."

Elai Dankner, West Hawaii Explorations Academy, was also a 2009 BELL Hawai'i scholarship recipient.
