

Wood Show brings in \$5,000 for Kohala Watershed Partnership

After tabulating nearly 300 votes made by the public during the recent Wood Show at Harbor Gallery, the People's Choice award-winner has been determined.

Perry Policiccio, of Hilo, has won the award for People's Choice for his entry titled "Life is Like a Bowl of Cherries." The piece was also purchased by a collector from California.

As a result of the show, the Kohala Watershed Partnership is receiving a check in the amount of \$5,000 in support of their efforts to restore the watershed and forests above Kawaihae and Pelekane Bay.

"This is just awesome. We are thrilled to receive this kind of support for our programs, which will have a long-term benefit to our immediate environment for generations to come," said Melora Purell, program coordinator.

"We're going to plant lots of trees," she added, when asked what they were going to do with the money.
